## Tutorials

Sunday's tutorial on "Jakarta Struts" by Keld Froberg and Søren Skyum was well attended. JAOO Today caught up with two of the attendees of the Struts tutorials at the end of the day: Ale Ganzeveld and Nico Brandenburg both from TNO, Holland.

*Have you been to JAOO before?*

Ale: Yes, this is my second time here. I started coming here because I found that I did not learn much new when going to JavaOne; and so we looked for other relevant conferences that might be interesting.

*How can you use the things you learn here in your work at home?*

Ale: We work in the geology department at TNO, in a research project making a lot of subsurface data available on Holland's underground on the Internet. This public-service system is all built on Java and J2EE technology, and we have built our own frameworks for the web front end. So we came here today to evaluate, if we might use Struts for our next major project.



*So will you use Struts now?*

Nico: Well, after today, we're not sure. There is a lot of overhead in a large framework like Struts, so it might be too much. We have learned a great deal on the whole Struts framework, and we can definitely use some of those structures when we build our own.

*What do you look forward to in this year's conference?*

Ale: Last year I tried to work through the conference schedule beforehand and decide which talks to go to; but I ended up changing my mind so many times during the conference that now I have decided to just follow the humors of the day.

*What are you doing tonight?*

Nico: We're going to a concert in the "Musik Huset" with Bartok Quartet. That's no guarantee that there will be musik by Bartok there; so we'll expect anything in 20th century classical music.

(Provided by NetPoint)

To get NetPoint High Speed Internet Access you need:

A laptop PC with web browser

A wireless card (IEEE 802.11b)

It's easy to connect to NetPoint High Speed Internet:

1. Associate your wireless card with the network netpoint.
2. Open your Internet browser and open a public webpage, e.g. [www.jaoo.dk](http://www.jaoo.dk)
3. The first time you will be redirected to a login page. Follow on screen instructions - choose "Conference attendee".
4. Type in code 8sw8-4qyZ

The wireless network covers all areas at the JAOO Conference.
